


# 2023 *Gratitude Report*

A safe place to stay for families with no income who need a place to stabilize and gain employment.



**113** people had a safe place to sleep last year with an average stay length of **4<sup>1/2</sup>** months in our Boulevard Shelter.



**97%** move into a permanent home after leaving our shelter.



**80%** acquired a source of income, through employment or benefit eligibility.

**100%** of families served have mainstream benefits.

## Homeless to Homes

Rapid rehousing program for families with some income who need help moving into housing quickly.

**115**  
PEOPLE

were able to move into their own home, with a 5 month average time to find housing.

**\$1k**  
A MONTH

was the average rent and utility assistance provided.

**100%**  
OF FAMILIES

had the ability to pay their own housing expenses 12 and 24 months after the cessation of housing benefits.

## Housing Stability

Homelessness prevention program for families with some income who need financial assistance to stay in their current home.

**168**  
PEOPLE

avoided eviction because of support from Nicholas House.

**\$2k**  
A MONTH

was the average rent and utility assistance provided to enable families to stay in their home.

**100%**  
OF FAMILIES

were able to pay their own housing expenses 3 months after financial assistance was provided. **90%** were able to pay their own expenses 12 months after assistance was provided.



## New Horizons

Permanent supportive housing for parents with chronic health conditions that make it difficult for them to maintain stable housing for their families.

**77**  
PEOPLE

served through the program.

**70%**  
OF FAMILIES

maintained or increased their income.

**100%**  
OF FAMILIES

stayed in the program 12 months or longer.
